Yes, [REDACTED] is correct in saying that collections start around [REDACTED] however any sample greater than about 12.5w requires the use of a dilating medication which is given to the patients 3 hours ahead of their procedure (these are called "cyto" patients). These cases usually do not conclude until about [REDACTED]. It is possible to get a patient who is 11w-12.5w earlier in the day, but as you know there is no way to be certain of their GA until they arrive for their appointment and receive a sonogram. In order to get your sample delivered to lab by [REDACTED] I will just have to keep you posted on [REDACTED] morning once I am able to look at the patient charts.
